The vote of New York State has at last been officially announced. The total vote was 893,191, being 117,819 less than the vote for President in 1876. The following are the Republican majorities: Canal 42,859; Hudson 122; Carr 1,855; Walkworth 6,873; Ward 4,524; Westfall 2,910; Seymour, Democrat is elected State Engineer over Sunde Republican, by a plurality of 11,024.

It is pretty well known that there is great animosity between S. J. Tilden and Abram S. Hewitt, who was Tilden's manager during the last Presidential campaign, and the reason has just been told to a reporter by Mr. Hewitt. It appears that Tilden told Hewitt to spend whatever money was necessary in the campaign of 1876, and to look to him for reimbursement. He spent over \$200,000, and when he applied to Tilden for the amount, Tilden said it ought to be paid by assessments on the party, and refused to pay more than his share. Tilden finally paid \$50,000, and about \$40,000 was raised by subscription. Hewitt's personal loss was therefore over \$60,000. Whether the money was judiciously spent by Mr. Tilden's agent or not, an honorable man would pay it without a word, but that doesn't seem to be his character, and yet he wants to be President. Tilden is said to be worth not less than \$20,000,000. Could anything be more than to refuse to pay a debt of this kind?

Grant's Next Trip.
It is announced in New York that passage has been secured for General Grant to sail for the West Indies on the steamer City of Alexandria, to sail for the West Indies on the 27th of December. Mr. John Alexander, one of the owners of the vessel, said last evening that the report that General Grant was soon to start from New York to Cuba and Mexico, had been engaged for the steamer City of Alexandria, and asked that state rooms might be reserved for General Grant in the steamer City of Alexandria. The company marked on the passenger list the two brig chambers to be reserved for the use of Grant. The City of Alexandria is an almost entirely new vessel, having only made three trips. The brig chambers in her are described as furnished in the most sumptuous style, with satin and silk hangings. The accommodations are all of a superior order. The steamer is to sail on Saturday, December 27th, for Havana and Vera Cruz, calling also at Progresso and Frontera in Mexico. Mr. Alexander thinks that Mexico is to be General Grant's destination. He saw that country during the Mexican war, and has frequently expressed himself to his friends as delighted with the climate he found there.
