The secret for manuring the corn is to keep the fertility near the surface when applied, and it is rare that another course is advisable.

The soil of a young orchard may be kept in cultivation until the trees begin to bear; grain should never be grown except Indian corn, but potatoes and root crops are the best.

Erie, Chautauqua and Cattaraugus counties in New York comprise what is called the Erie apple belt, and from there was shipped to market last fall \$1,545,000 worth of apples.

Tincture of iron is a practical remedy for foot rot in sheep. Keep the sheep on a dry floor, pare away the loose horn without injury to the vital parts, and then make daily application of tincture of iron.

Marshall B. Shaw, of Chesterfield, N. H., had one ewe that gave birth to three lambs, all ewes. Before the lambs were a year old each had a lamb, while the old ewe brought forth twins, making a flock of nine from one mother within a year's time.

A fox which was neither gray, red nor black, but had a gray stripe on each side, while the rest of the body was black, was killed in Cherry township, Indiana county, a few days ago. Reynard was of the female persuasion, very large, and the mother of five pups.

A well-known citizen of Londonderry, Chester county, on a recent Saturday night, was presented by his wife with a fine baby boy. On the same night his mare gave birth to a colt, his own to a calf and one of his sows to a litter of pigs. The most wonderful part of this influx of new life is that all the births are of female persuasion.

Chip dirt taken from under the wood pile is known by most to be excellent fertilizer for many kinds of shrubs and trees, and in view of these self-evident benefits derived from the use of decayed wood, farmers can devote a few days' time to no better work than hauling sawdust to next winter's use as bedding or an absorbent of liquid manure.

The dishcloth should never be used to wipe the floor, and napkins are for table use and not for wiping dishes. It is better not to use silver spoons for scraping out iron kettles, and no economical and thoughtful house-wife will allow the fishcloth to be used as a duster, or the new broom to sweep the back yard, or the best emulsified sauce pan to melt down snow.

Arrange work to save fuel. Mix bread at night so that it will be ready to bake while the oven is hot from the breakfast fire. If fruit is prepared the night before, pies may be baked after the bread. Hashes intended for breakfast should be made ready for cooking the night before. The kitchen should also be kept free of smoke and the kindlings ready for lighting the fire.
