The cow doctors have been unable to discover the cause of the disease or give any relief.

A valuable horse in Lawrence township, Clearfield county, had a hind leg broken, on Wednesday last by being kicked by another horse. The owner at once erected a heavy frame and put a roof over the horse. It was then raised up by means of straps so that he stands on three feet. The broken leg was set and a hole dug to prevent its resting on the ground, and the horse is still in that position, with some prospects of recovering the use of his leg.

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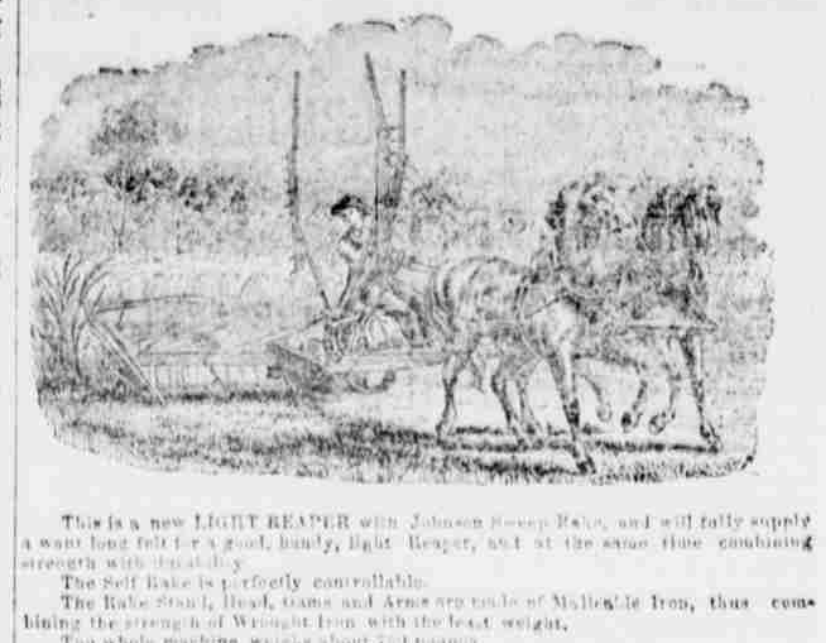
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
