Runaway Horses. The horse that has once acquired the habit of running away, says "The Book of the Horse," will bolt on the first opportunity. If you suspect his intention the best plan is to check it the moment he begins to move, taking hold of one rein with both hands, and giving it one or two such violent jerks that the rogue must pause or turn around. Then stop him, and if you doubt your being able to hold him, get off. Perhaps a too vigorous "plug" may make him cross his legs and fall—not a pleasant contingency, but anything is better than being run away with in the street. In open country you may compel the runaway to gallop with a loose rein until he is tired, or to move in a constantly-narrowing circle until he is glad to halt. A ten-acre field is big enough for this expedient. But the great point is to stop a runaway before he gets into his stride; after he is once away few bits will stop a real runaway—a steady pull is a waste of exertion on the part of the rider. Some horses may be stopped by sawing the mouth with the snaffle, but nothing will check an old hand. Another expedient is to hold the reins very lightly, and on the first favorable opportunity, as a rising hill, for instance, to try a succession of jerks. But the cunning, practiced runaway is not to be so much feared as the mad frightened horse. The mad horse will dash against a brick wall or jump at spiked railing of impassable height. I once saw a runaway horse, after getting rid of his rider, charge and burst open his locked stable door.

The Turpentine Remedy.—An aged physician in Washington, who is retired from practice, a man of extensive learning and high character, says that the younger practitioners laugh at him for recommending turpentine as a remedy for diseases of the lungs. He contends that they have nothing better to suggest; indeed, they have no remedy for consumption. He claims that in twenty-seven clear cases of throat disease the use of this remedy under his own direction has restored the several parties to fair health, one of these being his own wife, the other being a man who, from being unable to sit or lie in a prostrate position, has been for five years past doing engineer's work in the Treasury.

If horses paw in the stable, take a light chain, fasten it above the knee, let it hang loose, just so it will not touch the floor. If horses kick in the stable, fasten the chain on the hind leg, same way.—They will keep quiet while the chain is on, and there is no danger of hurting them. To cure a halter breaker take a half-inch rope a little over twice the length of the horse; make a loop in the middle of the rope (so it cannot slip) pass the horse's tail through it, then pass the ends of the rope through the rings of the halter, and hitch the ends. When he tries to pull, the rope will slip through the rings and all the strain comes on his tail. I have seen several horses broke in this way.

Apple Meringue.—Nine large apples, peeled and prepared the same as apple sauce, three tablespoonfuls sugar; cover tight in a sauce pan, when done strain through a colander, beat the yolks of four eggs, mix with this the rind of two lemons, put it in the pudding dish and cover it with the whites beaten to a stiff froth with a tablespoonful of sugar and juice of one lemon. Place the whole in the oven until the meringue is slightly browned.

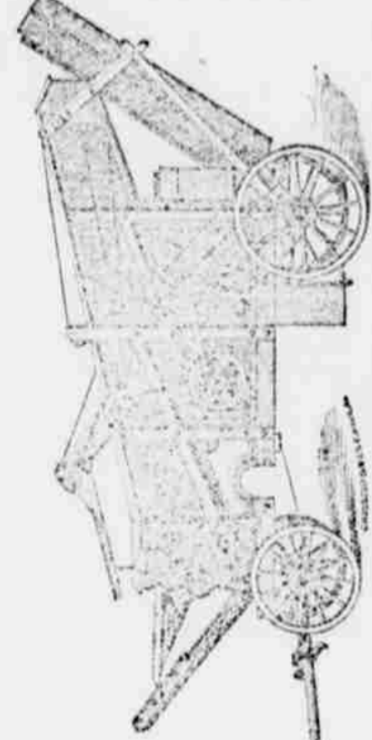
Every farmer knows that exposing potatoes to long to the rays of the sun, or to plenty of light and air, will soon rot them. A good farmer will dig and dry his potatoes at the proper time as quickly as is convenient, and take them to his lark cellar without delay, being careful not to have too many in one bin. Potatoes which are fine and ready when dug treated in this manner will remain good until new early potatoes are ripe. 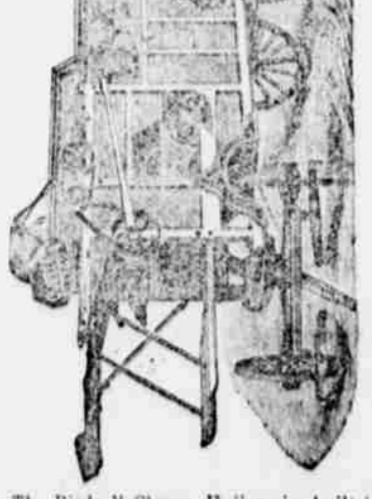

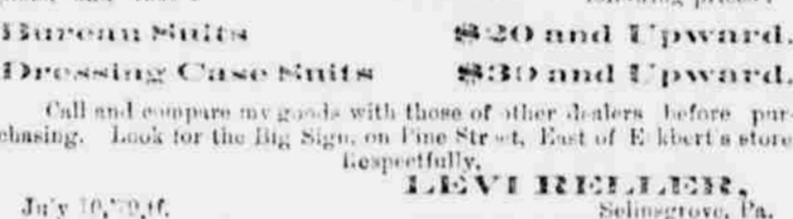

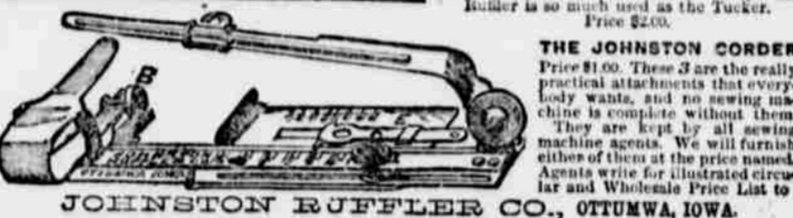
