Yesterday stieraoon. Monday, Mrs. Catharine Kramer, relect of the late Hon-George Kramer, departed this life at the residence of her son-in-law, Hon, Thoma as Bower, in Franklin, aged 86 years 3 months and 3 days.

Mrs, Kramer was born in Union County in 1794. She was the daughter of Captain Frederick Evens, a gallant efficer of the war of 1812 and one of the defenders of Fort Mellenry.

She was a woman of extraordinary intellectual powers and received as liberal an education as those early days afforded-not masculine, but a strong, compact physique, enjoying remarkable good unimpaired to a rare degree.


