Corn for Horses.—Is it or is it not economy to feed horses on corn in the ear. We have practiced it for a number of years, believing that the part which was not masticated, and so passed out of the horses without being digested was not equal to miller's toll. The toll is every tenth and this with the waste and time spent in going to the mill will make it fully equal to every eighth. Another thing for farmers who do not think enough about. Suppose that every tenth is not masticated and assimilated by the horse. It is kept on the farm, whereas, if it is left at the mill, the farm is so much depleted of plant food. We throw the whole ears into the manger, and let the work horses bite the kernels off as they like. As soon as horses get used to eating corn there is no danger of its producing any colic or other derangement of the bowels, but care must be taken not to begin too strong at first. Three or four ears of flint corn are all a horse should have to begin a diet of this food. The Southern and Western corn is lighter, and is not so apt to produce colic. In the South, corn is almost always fed in the ear, and so it is in the West, when fed at all. Corn is excellent feed for horses to work on, but not so good for fast driving. They are more quiet and tractable on corn than with any grain, and will do more hard pulling and draughty with less loss in condition. Oats make a horse sprightly and active, and hence should be fed sparingly to a colt. Oats have helped to make a great many balky, spavined and runaway horses. Corn is the best for eddible white being broken. It may be made lighter and not so heating by having wheat bran mixed with it.

Pictures.—Castle soap and water can be used on oil painting without danger, care being taken, of course, not to wet the back, or let water through the cracks.

For the ordinary dusting of pictures a silk handkerchief should be used.

An engraving would be made to appear cold by a bright and heavy gilt frame, though sometimes a plain unvarnished one looks well. Of course a margin of white paper is needed between the painted surface and the frame, so as not to make the contrast of brilliant too violent.

For hanging, use copper or silver wire. Nails cut out the inside of the cord. Water in which onions have been boiled, rubbed lightly over the frames, will keep insects away from them.

Cider Wine.—To three gallons of new, unfermented cider, add nine pounds of sugar; dissolve the sugar by stirring it well. Put it into a sweet keg, and let it stand four weeks; then strain it through a cloth strainer, and put it either into bottles or jugs; cork tightly, and it will keep for any length of time, as age improves it. Tree Planting.—Failures in tree-planting too often arise from the mistaken notion that when the roots of a tree are once in the ground the work is done. After a tree is carefully planted it should be mulched with leaves, straw, tan or any similar material, not so thick as to exclude the air, but sufficiently to retain the moisture in the soil; for, although there may be plenty of rain early in the season, the chances are that a drought more or less severe will follow.

To cure diarrhoea in pigs, change feed for a short time. Linnseed meal one part; bran seven parts; corn ground two parts; mix and add a little meal. For 100 pigs put two ounces of tincture of veratrum in a bucket of warm water, and moisten their food three times a day. Get a quart of the veratrum.

Never allow a mudhole to remain about a well. If your water is muddy and impure throw in a peck of lime to purify it. If animalcules appear in the water throw in a half gallon of salt to make them settle to the bottom.—Maryland Farmer.

All tools going out of use for the season should be put away in a whole and bright condition. Teach the boys the habit of cleaning shovels, hoes and cultivator teeth.

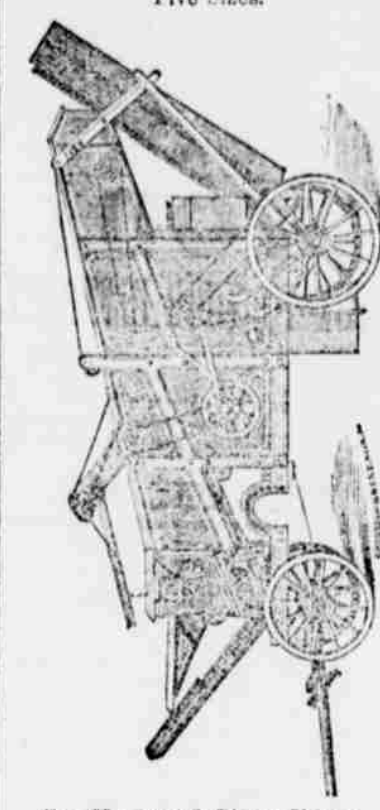
A horse weighing from ten to sixteen hundred pounds will eat about six tons of hay, or its equivalent, in a year.

Clear up swamps and low-lands. Grab up briar roots and stumps and when dry burn.

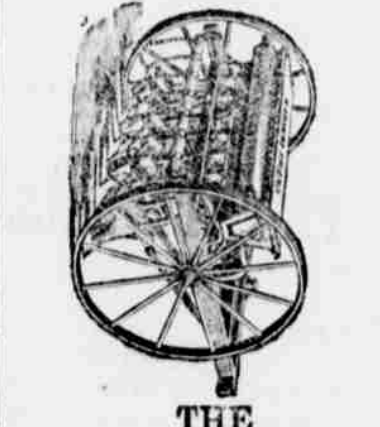

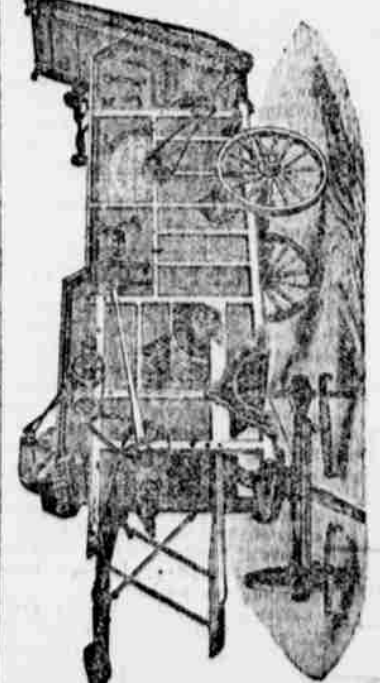

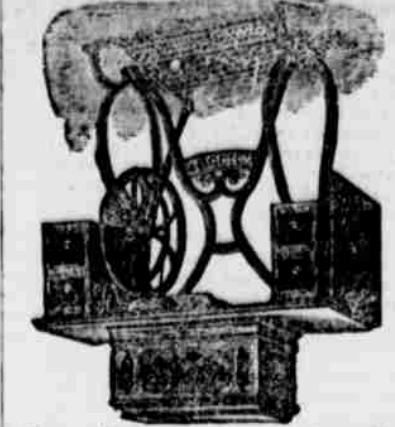
