Fernando Wood Dead.

The Hon. Fernando Wood, member of Congress from New York, died at Hot Springs, Arkansas, on Monday morning, Mr. Wood was born of Quaker parentage in the city of Philadelphia, June 14, 1812.

He was three times elected mayor of New York, serving in that office during the years 1853-55-57-61 and 62.

He was elected to Congress in 1840 and took his seat in 1841. He served in the 27th, 38th, 40th, 41st, 43d, 44th, 45th, and in the present 46th Congress, and was re-elected to the 47th.
