### FOR THE POST.

West End.

Mr. Ed.—Subscriber said enough last week to start tax-payers and Directors to inquiring into the conditions of the schools, the requirements, wages and worth of teachers as well as Superintendent. We agree that where there is enough care exercised by the directors in selecting teachers before examination, the work is generally satisfactory, but no originality like under Noelling's supervision. By far the greater part of school-tax is paid by persons who have children to be educated, the directors are also elected by the same class, who look for these men to do the best they know for the education of their children. Some say people elect directors to keep down expenses. Can they keep down expenses by having poor buildings, bad furniture, paying low wages and consequently having poor teaching? Through such management they will instead of paying for the education of the children, be obliged to pay for the erection of at least one penitentiary in each Normal School district, sum up the cost of the one being built in Huntington Co. and consider how many good school houses, well furnished, with competent teachers could be had for a term of five years for the amount expended.

Are the criminals of our county of the illiterate or intelligent class?

The times are better and we can afford to have our children well educated, by competent teachers and good supervision. If the schools do not advance they go back, and in the course of a very short time are in as poor condition as ever. The Supt. is not supposed to be a "fool" in the hands of the Drs. and at their request to endorse and allow a person to teach when he is fully aware that such person holds an illegal paper, making the directors liable to lose the state appropriation of the township (Adams) the Pres. of said board will be obliged to bend his conscience rather than to swear that all the schools were taught by teachers who held legal certificates. Such blundering is rather expensive. Mr. Noelling would never have endorsed that paper before inquiring about the qualifications and experience of the person. R. M. Scharf is satisfied with the progress of the educational interests of the Co. and has proven by his work that he is master of the situation, he need not be alarmed about the result of the election on the 3 of May. Noelling at the convention at Harrisburg claimed that the majority of our directors were too ignorant and should not be allowed to select the Supt. We were well satisfied with the Prof's work, in our schools, which goes to show that the Drs. at that time surely understood their duty—viz to elect the man who will do (educationally) the best for the greatest number of our children.
