AN IMPORTANT LAW.—From and after September 1st the Act No. 73, approved by the Governor on the twenty-ninth day of June, 1881, makes it unlawful for any person, firm, company, corporation or association, to pay their employes for work or services with orders, and any firm paying in any other way than by lawful money of the United States or by cash orders shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined in any sum not exceeding one hundred dollars, which shall go to the common school fund.

JUST AS YOU PLEASE.—Henry G. Vennor arrived in Washington, Tuesday, Sept. 13th, in response to inquiries, he wrote the following for the rest of the year. Indications recently observed and gathered from the telegraphic dispatches of the day, appear to me to point very much to wet weather, generally over the North American continent, and perhaps particularly in the northwest territories, on and after the 15th of the present month, while in England and Scotland, cold and stormy weather, possibly with snow falls in the northern sections, is likely to occur in the neighborhood of twenty-first and twenty-second days.
