

The number of persons killed on railroads in Pennsylvania during the year 1881 was 538, of which 35 were passengers, 174 employees, 306 trespassers on the track or the train. The number of people killed on the horse roads was 16.

President Arthur has appointed Dr. J. P. Wickerehem to be Charge d'Affaires at Copenhagen. Dr. W. was State Superintendent of Common Schools for fifteen years—a office which he ably filled and with entire satisfaction. His many friends will be pleased to learn of his new appointment.

Another giant in the person of Cheung Chi Lang, a Chinaman, eight feet tall and weighing 500 pounds, arrived in New York city last week. He is a native of Peking and is 35 years old, and will be exhibited at the Broadway museum. He cannot speak a word of English.

Emigrants from Europe are coming to New York at the rate of from 8,000 to 6,000 per day. The untillages of the west and south need not fallow for the want of muscle if this influx of foreigners continues for a year or two at the present rate. Uncle Sam is rich enough to give 'em all a farm, and if they are agriculturally inclined this large addition of laborers ought to add very materially to the wealth of a country in the increased grain crops that must naturally follow.

The Peace Conference is a success. It has reached a practical and gratifying conclusion. With sagacious action following these wise counsels, we have the opportunity for a united and triumphant party. The unanimous agreement of the Regular and Independent Committees upon the Independent principles is in itself an immense gain. It carries moral power and it will harvest practical fruits.

The members of the Conference have acted with discretion and patriotism and with fidelity to the interests confided to their hands. Their agreement on the preliminary of peace shows that the representatives of the two elements seek harmony upon honorable terms. It will be hailed by patriotic Republicans of all shades throughout the State, and only lamented by those who seek to distract and disrupt the Republican party.—Press.

Great Storm.

A terrible storm and cyclone pass over the Southern portion of Missouri on the 19th. The storm struck the town of Brownsville about four o'clock p. m. and in two minutes afterwards a most fearful scene of death and destruction was visible on every side. Large two story brick business houses were lifted from their foundations and the ruins scattered in confusion in all directions. Frame dwellings were overturned and crushed into splinters, while large trees were uprooted and carried long distances by the force of the storm. Hogs and other animals were picked up into the air and carried various distances and dropped lifeless along the track of the storm. The first intimation the people had of the terrible disaster impending was the appearance of a low hanging bluish funnel-shaped cloud, rising in the southwest, which seemed to be whirling and rolling in all directions assuming every conceivable form and traveling at a most fearful rate of speed. Just before the funnel struck the town a loud roaring noise was heard, which was followed by several loud electrical explosions at the southwestern limit. The storm seemed to move in its rapid rotary manner and everything it came in contact with was drawn up into its mouth only to be dropped again in a few seconds, twisted and crushed out of all shape. Fifteen brick and two frame houses, and between fifteen and twenty dwellings, the Missouri Pacific depot and telegraph office, were entirely destroyed and numerous other buildings were badly damaged. Seven persons were killed, fourteen mortally wounded and sixteen seriously hurt. The following are the killed: E. Craggs, farmer; Claude Meyers, dry goods merchant; Z. K. Arthur, clerk; Con White city marshal; J. S. Payne, minister, and James Miller, clerk. Every house, tree and shrub in its path of 150 yards wide was leveled to the ground.
