Bi-Centennial Notes.

The Trades' Display on Wednesday, October 25th, will exhibit in procession the growth of the industries in Philadelphia and Pennsylvania.

All grades of cotton and woolen goods will be shown in process of manufacture. The Carpet Manufacturers, Tool Makers, Mechanical and Machinery Establishments, Rolling Mills, Foundries, &c.

Wednesday afternoon the Welsh singers from Schuylkill, Luzerne, and Carbon counties will contend at 32d and Chestnut, Alliance Building.

Wednesday evening the Illuminated Procession, consisting of Historical Pageants and the Epic of the East, including representations of the prominent events in the history of the old and new world.

Each tableau will be on a car which will be drawn by 4, 6, or 8 horses. The cars will be from 20 to 40 feet long, as required by the subject.

This grand and novel feature will move through the streets of Philadelphia, the finest exhibition being made on Broad Street.

We understand that the Philadelphia & Reading Railroad will run special trains for all points of its main line after this procession is over, on which the reduced rate excursion tickets will be accepted.

Thursday, October 26th, a Grand Musical Festival by the various singing Societies of the city and State, including the Welsh and Germans.

National sports of the nations that settled Pennsylvania, with prizes to the most successful participants, will close the attractions of the day.

Friday, October 27th, Grand Military Display, with review of land and naval forces. The entire National Guard of the State of Pennsylvania, with visiting companies from neighboring States, will compose the procession.
