C. B. Lines, Esq., New-Haven, Conn. DEAR SIR:—Allow me to address you, and through you, the gentlemen of your Colony, on the eve of your departure for Kansas.

I hope and believe that you will find a settlement there to be a means of great prosperity. You are not like the early settlers of New-Haven going upon a doubtful enterprise, to a poor soil, in a severe climate, the ocean on one side and a wilderness on the other.

You will not go far from us. In our day we measure by miles, rather than distance; by hours, not miles. You will not be as far from your old homes as one Sabbath is from another.

You are not going upon an errand not one whit less Christian and less heroic than that of our common ancestors, who founded New-Haven. You are pioneers of towns and cities.

You are to be a part of a Christian colony, a colony of the future. You will put forth your strength and talents in a year that will be a glorious year.

And where the morning sun now rises upon herds of wild buffalo, caught deep in wild grass in your own lifetime it will bring forth the cry of multitudes and the noise of a city.

Nevertheless such people have been called upon the young State of Kansas that it is a matter of courage to settle there, and a matter of duty to go there.

To go there determined to transplant to its soil that tree of liberty which under God has in other States borne and shrank down in its boughs all the fruits of an unparalleled prosperity.

It is a pleasure and honor to us to be in any way connected with such an enterprise, by furnishing to the emigrant material of metal and iron. We will put forth a double interest in your company.
