

Pierce's Dictatorship.

It will be remembered that President Pierce, in his special Kansas Message sent to Congress on the 24th of January last, charged the Kansas troubles upon the Emigrant Aid Societies of the North, and upon Gov. Reeder for not proceeding to a more speedy organization of the Territory, by the election of a Legislature and the enactment of a code of laws.

The New York Tribune publishes the following letter from Mr. Thomas Sherwood, which shows that the President had expressed to Gov. Reeder's friends precisely the opposite opinions to those expressed in the Message.

Hon. A. H. Reaser, Dear Sir: Yours of the 13th is received. I reply, I state that in the month of February, 1855, I had a conversation with President Pierce in the presence of Hon. A. S. Packer, at the White House, concerning Kansas Territory and the charges against you of unfair conduct towards the Pro-Slavery party, and of speculations in lands.

As I was recently from the Territory, questions were asked of me which I answered candidly as far as I was able. The President, in that conversation, speaking of you, said that you had acted like just, honorable and high-minded man, and that you must and should be sustained; that you had taken the same course as he would have done had he been in your place.

Another Gross Offense.—We have just received a letter from Rev. S. L. Adair, pastor of the Congregational Church at Oswatimie, K. T., written from his Asylum near the Territory. He says: "I am now where I have fled from the tyrant Pierce and his 'Border Ruffians'."

From Kansas. St. Louis, Saturday, Oct. 19, 1856. We have just received a letter from K. T. dated to the 14th inst. Col. Cooke, at the head of 400 emigrants, had arrested a company of 240 emigrants near the Nebraska line.

Advices from Nebraska City give further particulars of the recent arrest of emigrants. The party numbered two hundred and fifty, including women and children.

On arriving at Plymouth, Kansas, on the 10th instant, they found Deputy Marshal Preston, with several armed men acting as a posse, and a large artillery drawn up to oppose their further progress.

The New York Evening Post is credibly informed that a meeting of the friends of Buchanan was lately held in New York, which was attended by a leading member of the Fillmore State Committee, and by whom it was arranged that Fillmore's name was to be formally withdrawn about a fortnight before the election.

The National Era, has published a card in the California papers, denying the report started by the Buchanan leaders, that Col. Fremont, while a Senator, struck him, for words spoken in debate, and then challenged him.

The Radical Abolitionist, the special organ of Gerrit Smith, the abolition candidate, devotes its entire October number to the topic of slavery, and in urging them not to vote for Fremont. We give a brief extract to the point.
