Proposing Amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met: That the following amendments are proposed to the Constitution of the Commonwealth, in accordance with the provisions of the tenth

FIRST AMENDMENT. There shall be an additional article to said consti-tution to be designated as article eleven, as follows: ARTICLE XI.

ARRICE XI.

OF PUBLIC DEBTS.

Section 1. The state may contract debts, to supply casual deficits or faffures in revenues, or to meet responses not otherwise provided for; but the aggregate amount of such debts direct and contingent, whether contracted by virtue of one or more acts of the general assembly, or at different periods of time, shall never exceed seven hundred and fifty thousand stollars, and the money arising from the creation of such debts, shall be applied to the number for which.

SECOND AMENDMENT. There shall be an additional article to said constitution, to be designated as article XII, as follows:-ARTICLE XII.

OF NEW COUNTIES. No county shall be divided by a line culting off over one-tenth of its population, (either to form a new county or otherwise,) without the express assent of such county, by a vote of the electors thereof; nor shall any new county be established, containing less than four hundred square miles. THIRD AMENDMENT.

From section two of the first article of the constitution, strike out the words, "of the city of Phila-delphia, and of each county respectively;" from section five, same article, strike out the words, "of Philadelphia and the of several counties:" from sec. seven, same article, strike out the words, "neither the bords, band no and athie site lice tion four, same article," and in lieu thereof insert the following:

"Section 4. In the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in every seventh year thereafter, representatives to the number of one hundred, shall be apportioned and distributed equally, throughout the state, by districts, in proportion to the number of taxable inhabitants in the several parts there of; except that any county containing at least three thousand five hundred taxables, may be allowed separate representation; but no more flian three unties shall be joined, and no county shall be divided, in the formation of a district. Any city containing a sufficient number of taxables to entitle it to at least two representatives, shall have a separate representation assigned it, and shall be divided into convenient districts of contiguous territory, of equal taxable population as near as may he, each of which districts shall elect one representative."

At the end of section seven, same article, insert these words, "the city of Philadelphia shall be divided into single senatorial districts, of contiguous ter-ritory as nearly equal in taxable population as possible; but no ward shall be divided in the formation

The legislature, at its first sension, after the adop tion of this amendment, shall divide the ciry of Philadelphia into senatorial and representative districts, in the manner above provided; such districts to remain unchanged until the apportionment in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four. 


