stacking corn-stalks, it would be always beneficial. They fill a large bag, 3½ feet high, and 20 inches in diameter, with straw, and place it vertically in the center of the stack, putting the barley, oats, or hay. whichever it may happen to be around it. As the stack rises, they lift the bag; and so on to the top. In this way, there is a chimney med in the center of the rick of hay, into which the steam or gases generated find their way, and escape readily.
