the forest or nursery. Important as these considerations certainly are, in reference to shade and ornamental trees, there is the more significant inquiry what is to become of our forests? The fail ure of springs and streams, the terrible force of the winds, the unusual severity of the win ters, and in many places prospective barren-ness, all in consequence of the loss of our for-ests, should induce efforts to stay the desolation. If farmers could be persuaded that they could produce as much from fifty acres well tilled, as from a hundred indifferently maraged, would they not be willing to til the fifty and devote the balance to trees ? Barns also, and stables, orchards and gar dens, may be tempered against both the heats of summer and the blasts of winter, by rows and groves of shade trees. They beautify a roadside, and they afford grateful shelter fo cattle, stock, &c., in every field—affording more benefits in various modes, than the losses from the amount of room which they occupy, and the soils, they exhaust. They give also homes for the birds, to make mel-ody and kill off the insects graiis...In se-lecting trees, those which are clear and hardy, and do not throw up roots, should be closen; none should be placed so near a fence or any building as to keep it damp, or to prevent the sam from touching it during some part of cattle, stock, &c., in every field-affording to circulate around both tree and buildings to make them healthier and longer-lived.

PROTIDE THE HAT-CAPS .- This valuable improvement still fails to receive that atten tion which it deserves. We have already written so much supon the subject that we need offer little more now. We will say, however, that we are more than ever convinced of the great advantages resulting from their use. They may be cheaply and quickly made of coarse colton, 11 to 2 yards square, roughly hemmed, and provided with loops at each corner for stakes, or stones sewed in to the corners, as weights to keep them from blowing off." A quantity of these always at hand to throw over cocks of uncured or cured hay, when a storm comes up, will not unfre quently save more than their cost on a single occasion, while they may be used for ma-ny years not only to cover hay, but grain left in the field. A full description of them, with illustrations, was given, last July (see vol. 17, pr 207). We have usually, advised farmers to make them at home, but many will not take even the slight trouble required such to the advertisements in our last, and also in the present number. 


