

English in England. The London Athenaeum concludes a long review of Bartlett's Dictionary of Americanisms as follows: "Meanwhile we may repeat what we have recently asserted, that our pure English has for some time been in great peril, and indeed suffering much damage, here at home. It is not only that skilled writers rather use in their English words, but there are young and idle folk among us who, although they have been to school, and ought to be learned and to know better, gladden their foolish hearts and add to the confusion of the language, by cutting out new shapes of speech, and, by often using them, gaining for them a home on their lips. If not in our words, at least in their use, we must keep watch, or they will make our mother tongue itself unrecognizable."

The Use of Quail.—Wm. Norton, an intelligent, observing farmer boy, who makes his home in the southern part of Illinois, has recently been studying the habits of the quail and gives the following testimony to the Cincinnati Freeman: "He observed a small flock commencing at one side of the field, talking about five rows following them regularly through the fields, scratching and picking about every hill, till they came to the other side of the field; then taking another five rows on their return, and thus continuing till he thought they were certainly pulling up the corn. He shot one, and then proceeded to examine the corn ground. On all the ground they had been over he found but one stalk of corn dislodged; that was scratched nearly out of the ground, but the kernel was still attached to the stalk. "In the crop of the quail, he found but one out of twenty-one striped vine bugs, that still retained their individuality, a mass apparently consisting of hundreds of minute bugs, but not one kernel of corn."
