Green; aged, Iventy-aix years. In February last, Mr. Green enlisted and became a member of Company P, of the 550 Regt., PL, Vol., 1st Division, 2d Army Corps. His was called very soon to participate in active military service, being among the troops engaged in the capture of Rich-mond. During the march of his regiment from Richmond to Washington, he was attacked with ty-phold fover, which terminated his life after an ill-ness of nearly three weeks. The remains were brought to Harford, his former place of realdence, and interred on Sanday, the 4th of June, where a discourse was poenched to a large assembly, by Rev. A. Miller.
