With the Wool - The following receipt is given for tanning sheep skins with the wool on: "Take one half-pound of alum and two of saltpetre, pulverize well and mix thoroughly. Sprinkle this powder on the flesh side of the skin and then the wool side. Wash in clean water. In two or three days, as soon as dry, take down, scrape the flesh side with a blunt edged knife till clean." The process is simple. Such skins make excellent saddle covers.

Verdigris - The crops of Pennsylvania, in 1865, are reported to be unusually good. The wheat crop is estimated to be 100,000,000 bushels, an increase of 10,000,000 bushels over the crop of 1864.
