AS follows: The three and four year old colts will trot the first day of the Fair, commencing at two o'clock, p. m. Sweepstakes premium of \$50, for all horses that never trotted in public within three minutes, at two o'clock, p. m., second day. The double team trot for \$100 premium, and the single \$500 premium will be trotted on the third day, commencing with the double team, trot at 12 o'clock, m. Immediately after it is decided the trot for single horses will come off.

The Annual Address will be delivered from the Judge's stand, at 10 o'clock, a. m., on the third day of the Fair. Immediately after the address, the Reports of the Judges will be read at the office of the Treasurer, in Glenwood, on and after the 12th of October, except in classes 30, and 31, which will be paid on the last day of the Fair, after the decision of the Judges.

Persons competing for premiums in classes 20 and 21 will be required to pay 10 per cent on amount of premium for which they enter. Feed will be furnished for stock competing for premiums, on or near the Fair Grounds, free of charge.

Articles and animals intended for exhibition should be entered as early as possible. Animals and articles entered for exhibition will have cards attached with number and class as entered on entry book; and it is required that exhibitors file with their cards of the number and class previous to placing their articles on the grounds.

The books of entries will be closed at nine o'clock, a. m., on the second day of the Fair, except for those trotting for the \$100 and \$500. They will have the privilege of entering until ten o'clock the third day of the Fair, after which time they will be received no longer. All animals and articles for exhibition must be on the Fair Grounds as soon as nine o'clock, Thursday, the second day of the Fair, at which time the Judges will take the entry books and proceed to decide the merits of the articles and animals entered for premiums. All articles and animals entered for premiums must remain on the Fair Grounds until the close of the Fair. There will be a man on the ground to furnish grain, hay, and straw, to any persons wishing one same.
