A Farmer's Advice to Farmers.

To Insure Eggs for Winter.

If an old hen has been laying well all summer, and is late in moulting she requires rest and time to recover from the moult; and if cold weather comes on her when but partially moultweather comes on her when but partially moulted, she will, perhaps, be a long time recovering the condition proper for laying. If, however, she is allowed to sit late in summer, so as to rest her from egg-laying, and during the time she is tending her brood she is encouraged to moult, by warmth and generous feeding, she will, when her moult is completed, soon get-into laying condition, and, by good management, may often be kept laying all the winter, and lay better and larger eggs than pullets. I give a little barley and oats mixed each day, and have the run of a small field. To prevent their wanting to sit, I regularly took up all the ergs so laid, and never lenve but two in a nest.—Correspondence London Field.

From experiments conducted by Messrs. Drummond & sons, Stirling, England, a fact is proved that has only been suspected by some farmers, that in many cases a considerable portion of the seeds of the grasses and clovers are lost, owing to the manner of sowing and covering them. Germination of such small seeds is often wholly prevented, owing to the septh of the covering of the earth; and when the seeds do germinate, the weak shoots do not reach the surface, and thus they are not established in the soil. The most favorable depth is proved to be a quarter of an in-th or timothy, grass, and clovers seeds generally. The proportion per cent.
