DEEP PLOUGHING. BY PROF. J. J. MANN. NEWARK, N. J., April 25.

Dear Sir:—In my last communication, I promised to give you a more complete account of my experience in deep ploughing.

1. The mechanical sustaining of the roots of plants, and necessarily of the plants themselves, in proper position; and at the same time, that the mass of soil should be previous to the increase of length of the roots.

2. The reception and retention of the gases, fluids, &c., which Nature has sent to the soil, until the requirements of the growing plants shall appear to them.

3. Such mechanical arrangement of particles as shall best tend to the ready partition of excessive quantities of water, &c., &c., in excess of what is necessary for the vegetation.

4. Free admission of such amount of air as the atmosphere, by combination with the constituents of the soil, cause them to undergo changes beneficial to their general properties.

It is well known that, if soil is disintegrated but to slight depths, the roots of plants, on reaching the compact and unbroken portion, cease to be healthy, and refuse to sustain the plant—this refusal when seeded down with the above-named substances, and not properly ploughed, will run out—for the influence of the atmosphere remains, and, until it is supplied by the necessary amount at the bottom of the roots, consequently the plants die.

Turning in Green Crops.

The stage at which a crop is turned into the soil would be of the greatest value as manure, in a point of profitable instance.

It is a point of view which has been a common opinion that the plants produced by the most beneficial means are those which have the largest amount of their roots in the soil, and hence the soil has a more abundant supply of water, &c., &c., than when a large amount of the roots is placed in the air.

As the roots of the plants are turned into the soil, the atmosphere, by combination with the constituents of the soil, cause them to undergo changes beneficial to their general properties.

This effect is common to all plants, and no error is more common than to judge of the length of roots of plants. The roots of the ordinary Corn stalk will average 5 to 6 feet in length, and if a field be planted with Corn to hills 4 feet apart, no portion of the soil to the depth of 20 feet will be ploughed, of one inch cube, can be so small that does not contain roots. Many of them are too small to be discerned by the naked eye, but still they exist, and form an almost imperceptible part of the soil.

Soil has the power to absorb and retain many of the gases found in the atmosphere until required by the growing plant, and this retention is just in proportion to the quantity of surfaces of particles exposed, and, therefore, an unploughed field, or not well ploughed, will retain more of the gases than a well ploughed field, and this will be much to its disadvantage.

Compact soils will not permit the water resulting from rain, &c., to enter freely, and shallow-ploughed lands will hold a large quantity of water near its surface, from deeper disintegration of the soil, run downward to a sub-soil capable of receiving it. Heavy judgements of water about the roots of plants is a common cause of their death, while large quantities of water over their surface, without being received, will carry off the more valuable portions of the manure.

Growing plants not only receive but throw out matter from their roots, for they reject certain portions which are termed excrementitious; these, in well disintegrated soils are got rid of, but when shallow-ploughed they remain on the impervious soil, and from their proximity to the roots, injure the plants.
