

Later from Europe.

The steamer *Albatross* from America and Asia have all arrived since our last. The chief news is the report of the death of Sir Robert Peel, about the oldest and certainly the ablest statesman of England. The particulars of his death are thus given. On Saturday evening, June 29, while proceeding from his residence in Whitehall to Constitution Hill, his horse suddenly shied at a smothering spout, kicked up his heels and threw Sir Robert over his head on his face. Although rendered insensible by the fall, he retained hold of the reins, and the animal, having thus checked, lost his footing and fell heavily on the baronet, bruising and crushing him mortally. All the medical aid in London was at his disposal, but they could not save him, and he lingered along in a state of insensibility until Tuesday, when he expired. His age was 83, and he had been in active public life since 1800.

Louis Phillips is said to be dying of a cancer in the stomach, and it is thought he cannot survive a month longer. From France there is nothing of interest. The new Electoral Law will disfranchise 6,000,000 electors, or two-thirds of the whole body.

Great excitement prevails in Lisbon on account of the arrival of an American Squadron in the Tagus to enforce the claim of £70,000. Twenty-one days were allowed by the American Commander for a final reply. Fears were entertained of refusal. The Portuguese Government have determined to resist the demands upon them.

Later from California.

The Crescent City, from Chagres, July 13, arrived at New York on Monday, bringing 157 passengers, and \$1,111,000 in gold dust.

The steamer *Columbus* arrived at Panama on the 6th inst., having left San Francisco on the 19th of June. She brought 250 passengers and \$1,300,000 in gold dust on freight, and the mail. The \$1,300,000 in gold dust, brought on freight by the *Columbus*, was detained at Chagres to await the arrival of the steamer *Chorokee*.

A descriptive fire occurred at San Francisco, on the 11th of June. Over 400 buildings were destroyed. The loss is estimated at \$5,000,000.

Panama continues to be very healthy. There are but few cases of any kind of disease among the emigrants, and as the weather continues cool and pleasant, the health of the part of strangers will generally protect them from the dangers of illness.

The number of Americans at Panama, at the time the *Crescent City* left, was less than at any time in the last several years. It is attributed to the inferior facilities afforded to passengers for San Francisco.

The 4th of July was celebrated in Panama, by the American residents, with great enthusiasm.

There are steamers leaving every week, so that the emigrants have no difficulty in getting off without any difficulty in a few days.

By the politeness of the commander of the *Crescent City* we have Kingston papers to the 14th July, a reading nothing, however, of moment beyond the receipt of the 7th of July, and San Francisco papers to the 15th of June.

The *Nan Francisco Herald*, of the 17th and 18th, and the *Pacific News*, of the 18th, give facts of the parties who suffered damage by the late fire, and long for us to copy.
