Agricultural Fair

The Fair of the Susquehanna County Agricultural Society was held on Thursday, Oct. 7. The attendance was much larger than in any year before...

An eloquent address was delivered by Hon. Luther Kidder, of Luzerne, for which the thanks of the Society were voted...

The Committee on Butter Report: That this great branch of our agricultural products is receiving more attention than heretofore...

The competition this year is very far in advance of previous years. There are offered 23 Firkins and 6 Tubs, from some of the best dairies of the county...

The competition was spirited. The Plowing fixed the time for doing the work at one hour and a quarter for thirty eight square rods...

The plowing was all very good. The Rules required it to be at least six inches deep, and the ground was more than six inches deep...

The second premium is awarded to Mr. John F. Deans, of \$3.00. The third premium of \$2 to Mr. Wm. E. Anstis.

The plowing done by Mr. Carter, who has taken the first premium for three successive years, was beautiful, but in consequence of not being within the time required by the rules of the Society...

The Committee on Corn made the following report: The awards not coming within the rules of the Society, the premiums were not paid.

Hyde Crocker mowed his corn in the hill. Rows running North and South 3 1/2 feet apart in two running east and west. From 3 to 5 grains in a hill, 2 bushels of lime, mixed with 5 bushels of Plaster, was applied to the corn very soon after it came up.

Cattle - Greatest number of neat Cattle, Franklin township \$10, 2nd best, Bridgewater, \$8.

Swine - Best pair of hogs, Wm. Harkins, \$3. Best pair of pigs, Wm. Harkins, \$3.

Small Grain - 1st premium, Winter wheat, Otis Ross, \$5; 2nd, 20 qts per acre; 1st premium Spring wheat, D. Starke, \$5; 2nd, 20 qts per acre.

Domestic Manufactures - Best Carpet, L. W. Reed, \$3; 2d, Mrs. Otis Ross, \$1.

Best cotton socks, A. C. Warner, \$1; 2d, best, F. M. H. Beck, Certificate.
