The Gold Diggings of Australia

Australian advices have reached England by the overland mail. From Sydney they reach the 29th July, being four weeks later than previously received. From Port Phillip they arrive on the 17th of July. In each case they fully confirm the recent statements regarding the yield of gold in New South Wales and Victoria.

From the influence of these supplies the price had fallen to 60s. or 62s. per ounce, although the miners, being now rich, were generally indisposed to press sales. It was estimated that there was at least 2,000,000 of unemployed money in the hands of laborers.
