

A SHORT VOYAGE AROUND THE GLOBE.—The iron screw steamer Argo, recently arrived at Southampton, Eng., has been round the globe in 139 days. She was 64 days on her passage from Southampton to Melbourne, via the Cape of Good Hope; occupied the same length of time in returning via Cape Horn. She is completely self-rigged, and has a steam power of 300 horse, to be used in adverse winds and calms. She has been 2,105 miles of coast, about 17 tons of a day, and averaged 230 miles a day, or about 9 1/2 miles an hour during the entire voyage. In fair winds under canvas, the Argo made 13 and 14 knots an hour for successive days; and 11 and 12 knots under the screw. The crew consisted of 120 men, and the crew fished for the Yankee clippers must look to their honors if John Bull set to building such vessels as the Argo.—Boston Traveller, 17.
