

being the present year on Friday the 15th day of October next, there to do and perform the duties required by law of said judges. Also that where a Judge by sickness or unavoidable accident is unable to attend said meeting of Judges, then the certificate or return of the said Judge shall be taken charge of by one of the Inspectors or Clerks of the election of said district, who shall do and perform the duties required of said Judge unable to attend.

It is the duty of the Inspectors and Clerks of the election of each county, having met as aforesaid, the Clerk shall make out a fair statement of all the votes which shall have been given at such election within the county, for every person voted for as such member or members, which shall be signed by said Judges and attested by the Clerks; and one of the said Judges shall take charge of such certificate and shall produce the same at such meeting of the Judges from each county at such place, and such certificate or may be appointed by law for the purpose, which meeting shall be held on the seventh day after election.

The return Judges of the Senatorial District composed of the counties of Susquehanna, Bradford and Tioga, will meet in the Borough of Towanda, Bradford county, Tuesday, the 21st day of October next, to perform the duties enjoined by law upon said Judges.

The return Judges of the Representative District composed of the counties of Susquehanna, Wyoming, and Sullivan, will meet at the Court House in the Borough of Montrose, the County of Susquehanna, on Tuesday the 21st day of October next, to perform those duties enjoined by law upon the said Judges.

Also, that in the 61st section of said act, it is enacted that every general and special election shall continue without interruption or adjournment until seven o'clock in the evening when the polls shall be closed.
