

the aforesaid district shall respectively take charge of the certificate or returns of the election of their respective districts, and produce them at a meeting of one Judge from each district at the Court House in the Borough of Monticello, on the 13th day of October next, there to do and perform the duties required by law of said Judges. Also that where a Judge by sickness or unavoidable accident is unable to attend said meeting of the Judges, the certificate or return aforesaid shall be taken charge of by one of the Inspectors of the election of said district, who shall do and perform his duties required of said Judge as if he were present. A copy of both will be filed in the 81st section of said act, it is enacted that when two or more counties shall comprise a district for the choice of a member or members of the Senate of this Commonwealth, the House of Representatives of said States or States or of this Commonwealth, the Judges of the election in each county, having met as aforesaid, the Clerks shall make out a fair statement of all the votes which have been cast in each election within the county, for every person voted for as such a member or members, which shall be signed by said Judges and attested by the clerks; and one of the said Judges shall then change of said certificates of votes, and shall return the same at a meeting of one Judge from each county at such place in such district, as or may be appointed by law for the purpose, which meeting shall be held on the next following election.
