of an artery, either internally or externally.

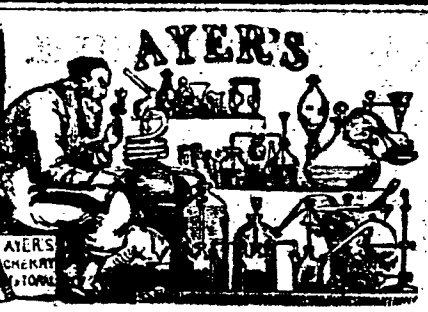
