Cut Feed for Stock.

Much has been written on this subject.

The argument in favor of cutting up feed for stock may be stated in a few words. If a farmer has no fodder to dispose of, except the "merchandise hay," there will be little need of cutting it.

But most persons have constant, and hay and straw a little damaged, which if fed out unprepared would be much wasted.

Now, let this be run through a straw-cutting machine with a little meal and moistened, much will be a vastly more palatable dish, little or none will be wasted, and the rest will be well digested.

But good horses will eat odds and ends of meat, to save them, and make them more acceptable to their families; why should not the same principle of economy take in the farmer's barn? Besides, if cornstalks are not cut up, they find their way into the manure heap in a rough state, they are very slow to decay, and are troublesome in the shoveling of the manure, whereas, if they are cut, these objections are obviated.
