

SECESSION AT CHICAGO.

There was an interesting scene at Chicago on Thursday when the platform was reported by the committee.

Joshua R. Giddings, the King of the Abolitionists, offered to amend the second resolution so that it could be construed to endorse negro equality, and the doctrine of negro suffrage.

The amendment was instantly voted down, whereupon the old Abolition King rose and took his hat and started for the door.
