Virginia passed her secession act in secret, and sent some thousands of men to seize the Harper's Ferry Arsenal, and Lieut. Jones, who was in command, set lit on fire and fled to Hagerstown, and thence to Chambersburg, in Pennsylvania. By this serious event 15000 stand of improved arms, &c., were destroyed, to save

them from the robels.

The Bridges in Maryland have been burned, and the railroads obstructed, and various encounters have taken place between our troops and the mobs-in which many lives have been lost, mostly on the rebel side. To reach Washington troops must cut their way through, or go in vessels. Norfolk and the Gosport navy yard have been burned and several vessels des-Troyed.
