

On Friday last, a U. S. Grand Jury of the Circuit court in New York, made a presentation of the journals in the City and Brooklyn that oppose the war. The Tribune and Herald, which have advocated the right of secession, and the adoption of the Rebel constitution by the North were not presented, as the jury were all picked "Republicans." The jury ask the court if they can indict said Peace papers.

An important arrest was made yesterday in New York, a citizen of New Orleans having been taken into custody with two hundred thousand dollars intended for the Rebels in his possession. The money was raised in Europe, and was a loan for the so-called Confederacy.

Privateers are reported to be continually seen in the warm latitudes. They have been reported between Rio Janeiro and Pernambuco, and at Venezuela. The British steamer Eastern State, of Yarmouth, N. S., has arrived at Boston, bringing four hogheads and ninety-two barrels of spirits of turpentine, and thirty-one bales of North Carolina Cotton. This freight has been derived from some vessel that has run the blockade.

SLAVERY ABOLISHED.—Both Houses passed the Confiscation Bill, which deprives every master of all his slaves giving aid to the rebellion, as every slave in the Seced States must necessarily be his labor, given aid to the rebellion, this is a virtual and practical abolition of slavery and was so intended by its authors. The bill was passed against the protest of Crittenden and other conservative advocates of the war, by a vote of 60 to 48.

Second Quartermaster Bickley of the Third Pennsylvania Regiment, produced a record showing that there is extensive cheating being done by some parties who are supplying the troops with provisions. He says each barrel of salt pork falls several pounds short, each case of tea ten pounds short, that the beans are moldy, and that prime pork is not at all prime, but unfit to eat. The companies prefer mess pork.

The Washington correspondent of the Springfield Republican writes: The President is very firm. To all who despair of putting down the rebellion he says, "Remember that it is just as necessary to conquer the rebels to dictate decent terms of separation as it is for the purpose of preserving the Union. If we were to stop fighting now the rebels would dictate just such terms as they shall see fit. There would be no living with them in peace."

The rumors at Washington, on Friday respecting a change in the Cabinet, are more than re-echoed at Albany, it is positively stated that General Cameron is to retire from the Cabinet, and that other changes will take place. The conditions of the recent law have forced this action upon the President. Mr. Thurlow Weed has prepared the public mind recently for some change, and it is scarcely news to say that there has been much dissatisfaction with some members of the Cabinet for several weeks past, among the leading Republicans.
