

## NEWS ITEMS.

—From estimates made within the past few days it appears that the war is how costing the Government one million and a half of dollars daily.

—The Treasury is paying to the different States forty per cent. of the money paid for enrolling troops, etc. Pennsylvania draws \$600,000.

—The Army Vote.—The Philadelphia regiments in the field cost 1619 votes for Ewing, Dem., for Sheriff, and 108 for Thompson, Rep., for ditto.

—It is a little remarkable that the official accounts of battles and skirmishes on both sides always represent that great execution was done by their fire on their opponents. Would it not be better for both to stop bragging and tell only what they know?

—The Dublin Post reiterates the assertion that the agents of the United States Government are employed in Ireland recruiting for the army; but it is thought, that they are not very successful in their efforts.

—Grain of all kinds is arriving at Chicago at the rate of two millions of bushels per week, and an amount ranging from one to two millions is weekly shipped, chiefly for the ports of England and France.

—It is stated on the Richmond papers, that the miserably executed Confederate Treasury Notes have been so extensively counterfeited that they almost cease to circulate, no one being able to tell the truth from the false.

—All the houses in the vicinity of Louisville have been deserted by the Rebel inmates. Our soldiers make very free with the houses, which they flop off the houses and burn to make floorings for their tents. They evince a great partiality for doors and window-shutters, and all the houses therefore, present a very forlorn appearance.

—Some Philadelphia Democrats, who have hope of the election in the Camps, make the majority for Mr. Ewing for Sheriff of Philadelphia, over eight hundred. They express their apprehensions that the returns will not be correctly made out.

—Of the thirty-six Rebel prisoners to be released, according to the recent special order, only two took the oath of allegiance. The others took the oath not to bear arms against the United States.

—The Montreal Advertiser states that before the close of navigation, this season, the magazines at Quebec will be filled with an amount of military stores greater than they ever held before, and with arms, cannon and equipments for an army of 100,000 men, and ammunition sufficient for a war of three years duration.

—The following has been issued from the headquarters of the army as a special order:—"Fifty-seven of the United States soldiers detained as prisoners in Richmond, having been released, are taking an oath not to bear arms against the States in rebellion, and equal number of the prisoners of war taken from those States and now confined in Washington and New York, will be released on taking the prescribed oath of allegiance to the United States, or an oath not to engage in arms against the United States.

—The prisoners to be released will be sent, by the first opportunity, to Fortress Monroe, and thence, under a flag of truce, through the United States lines.

—Some Eastern (Western) journals take occasion quite unnecessarily, for facts do not warrant it, to say that Pennsylvania is belittled in furnishing troops. It is stated authoritatively, that the quota of Pennsylvania, demanded by the last proclamation from the President, is full.
