

Mr. Wade, of Ohio, from the committee on the conduct of the war, has made a report relative to the barbarous treatment of our wounded and dead soldiers at Manassas, by the rebels. It confirms fully the reports which have from time to time, been given to the public regarding the manner in which the rebels mutilated the bodies of our dead, and committed other atrocities.

We regret to announce the decease of Major General Charles F. Smith, the hero of Fort Donelson, which took place at Savannah, Tennessee, on Friday last, after an illness of some two or three weeks. Gen. S. was a native of Philadelphia, and graduated at West Point in 1825. He distinguished himself greatly in the Mexican war, and was beyond all question, one of the most accomplished and bravest officers in the military service of the country. His death is a national loss.

The Secretary of War transmitted to the House, on Tuesday a list of all the Brigadier Generals made from April 1st, 1861, to April 1st, 1862. The total number appointed during the year was one hundred and sixty-three; of these two have been appointed major generals, three have resigned, four declined, two died, and two were rejected. Total number in 1862, was one hundred and thirty-two.

On the 23rd inst., sixty-two were appointed, and 23 declined. The Wheeling Intelligencer publishes the official list of fifty-one counties of Western Virginia on the new constitution and gradual emancipation. The aggregate is 10,797 for 41 against the new constitution, and 6,053 for and 618 against emancipation.
