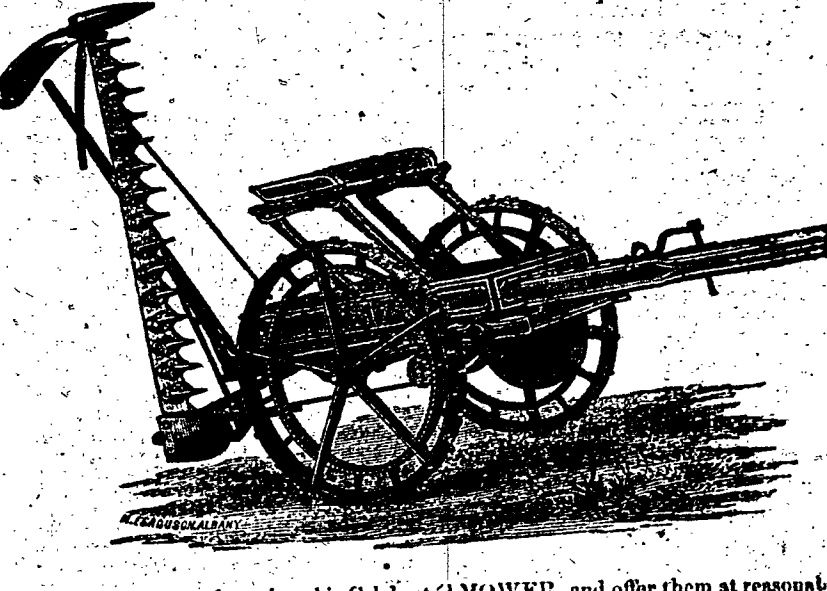

REPORT OF SOLON ROBINSON, CRITTENDEN'S COLLEGE, PHILADELPHIA COMMERCIAL COLLEGE.
