Important to Aged or Infirm Parents. -The following decisions just received by me from the Provost Marshal General, are published for the information of the public:

Circular No. 61 .- "In the case of aged or infirm parents, having two or more sons subject to military duty, election of the son to be exempted must be made BEFORE the draft, and his name should not then appear in the draft box."

"In the case of aged or infirm parents having two sons subject to military duty, the father, or if he be dead, the mother, may elect which of them shall be exempt. The right to this exemption does not rest upon the parents dependence on the labor of their sons for support. The law does not contemplate any such dependence." JAMES B FEY, Provost Marshal General.
