The Epidemic.—We clip the following from the Scranton Register: The epidemic which has prevailed to such an alarming extent in Carbondale for two or three weeks past is gradually yielding to the treatment of the physicians, and is looked upon with less horror. We learn that numerous cases have occurred in Greenfield, Scott and Abington, and in almost every instance has proved fatal. It is gradually making its way down the valley. Two cases in this borough have proved fatal, and at our present writing, three deaths have occurred at Hyde Park.

The fever has broken out again in Carbondale, and over 50 cases proved fatal in January, so far. The doctors say it is an old disease, and not contagious. We hear of a few deaths in Clifford from it. Will some reader in that quarter post us in the matter, if publicity be advisable?

RAILROAD ACCIDENT.—A collision occurred on Monday about nineteen miles east of Scranton on the Delaware Lackawanna & Western Railroad, killing Edward Connel and a man named Costello, of Hyde Park, and severely injuring two other persons. The farmer was a brakeman, and Mr. Costello was going to the Summit to visit a sick brother. The trains were freight trains on their way to Scranton, and one of the trains moving east. The passenger train was very much delayed by the accident, and did not reach Scranton until 10 o'clock, P.M.
