

THE GOLD MINES OF IDAHO.

WHAT A PRACTICAL GOLD HUNTER SAYS ABOUT THE IDAHO MINES.

(From a correspondent of the Chicago Tribune.)

I have been frequently asked how the placer mines of Idaho compare with those of California. My answer invariably has been there is no comparison at all.

Bannock city, the county seat of Boise county, is thought to be one of the best mining districts in the county, and in fact one of the best yet discovered in the Territory.

Six miles west of Bannock city are the placer mines of Centerville. It is situated on Grimes creek. The mines of Centerville are similar to those of Bannock city, and are equally as rich and extensive.

Six miles west of Centerville, we find Placerville, situated on Green creek. The mines of Placerville are equally good.

Four miles northeast of Placerville, situated upon Grimes creek, are the placer mines of Fort Pioneer. These are the placers from which the pioneers extracted the first gold from the virgin soil of Idaho.

We have faith in the richness of Idaho, but at the same time, I would not encourage emigration to the gold fields, for I am well aware that many will be disappointed.

The quartz mines of Idaho were discovered by an old trapper of that country in 1845, and were frequently shown to emigrants going to Oregon, whose fabulous reports of the richness of these mines were never fully credited until after the discovery of Bannock city, and indeed even now the richness of these mines does not fully justify the reports that have been made for the last fifteen years.

We have had many assays of the rock from San Francisco, and never yet have received less than two thousand dollars per ton.

Our supplies come from Oregon and California. From Oregon by the way of Portland, and from California by way of San Francisco and Portland.

Emigrants going to West Bannock from St. Joseph or Atchison, will find the stage road the nearest and best route, with the exception that they save seventy-four miles by leaving the stage road at Galesburg on the Platte river.

If you choose the northern route, you will leave Atchison at Fort Bridger, taking the Oregon road to Fort Conner, situated at the Soda Springs on Bear river; from Fort Conner to Fort Hall on Snake river.

I do not know of any other route that I could recommend as being good and safe. I am familiar with the route of which I have spoken, and know that you will experience but little trouble on either.
