FOR THE DEMOCRAT. Winter Record.—A Few Historical Items Selected.

1637-8. The winter unusually severe in New England. The snow lay about four feet deep from the middle of Nov. to the first week in April. 1641-2. The winter was of the severest kind. Boston lay was a bridge of ice as far as the eye could see—and the Chesapeake also frozen over.

Latter dates, in Bridgewater, Susq. co. and in other places. 1836. Jan. 8th, 9th and 10th, snow fell 3 1/2 feet deep on the level. Feb. 1st, snow 4 1/2 feet deep in the woods.

The Montrose Democrat of Jan. 1857, says: "The great storm of Jan. 18th extended in every direction from the Potomac to Canada. It is thought that the cold of Sunday has not been equalled in the present century."

The New Haven Register of Feb. 1st, 1857, says: "Long Island and Connecticut are now connected by solid ice, for the first time within the memory of man."
