Rules & Regulations.

The Committee and Secretary have an office on the Fair Grounds, where the Judges are requested to meet at 10 o'clock of the second day, when their names will be called and vacancies filled; and they will enter upon their duties and be ready to report in writing at 2 o'clock of the same day.

Exhibitors wishing to compete for premiums, will have their animals or articles entered on the Secretary's book the first day of the Fair, if possible; and a Card, which will be received from the Secretary, C. M. Gere, must be placed on the animal or article to be exhibited.

Superintendents of the different departments will have all the animals and articles systematically arranged. The officers of the society and superintendents will be known by their official badges.

A sufficient force will be in attendance day and night, to protect the property of exhibitors.

Arrangements are made for all stock over night. There will be a Committee in attendance at the entrance of the Fair Grounds to direct all persons driving in stock over night.

Stock can be entered ten days previous to the Fair by calling on C. M. Gere, Secretary.

No provision will be made for stalling stock over two years old.

No premium will be awarded to any persons exhibiting articles or animals not entered in the name of the bona fide owners of the same.

Premiums not called for within six mo. will be considered donated to the society.

Those driving in stock can be accommodated with pasture, as follows: Those coming from the North and New Millford at R. S. Searle's; from Brooklyn, at Wm. Jessup's; from Springville, the Wyalusing, the West and Owego turnpike, at J. S. Tarbell's farm, formerly Peckins'.

Daily Order of Arrangements. The gates will open from 7 o'clock, a. m. until 6 p. m. each day.

THURSDAY, SEPT. 20th.—First Day.—At 12 o'clock, m., the track will be open for promiscuous driving until 2 p. m.

At 2 p. m. the walking horses will take the track for exhibition.

At 3 p. m. lady and gentleman riding, and at 3 1/2 volunteer lady and gentleman driving, until 5 p. m.

FRIDAY, SEPT. 21.—Second Day.—At 11 a. m. a grand cavalcade of horses, entered for premiums, will take place on the track.

At 11 1/2 a. m., at the call of the Superintendent, class first will assemble in front of the Judges' stand for exhibition and final inspection.

At 12 p. m. single and matched horses. At 1 1/2 p. m., colts. At 1 p. m. mules. At 2 p. m. the address. At 4 p. m. announcement of the award of premiums.

To conclude with an exhibition of general driving on the track.

The Morning train from Great Bend connects there with the Cincinnati Express on the Erie Railway from the west; at Manunka Chunk with a train for Philadelphia and intermediate stations, arriving in Philadelphia at 6.30 p. m. and at New Hampton with a train for East Bethlehem, Allentown, Reading and Harrisburg, arriving at Harrisburg at 8.30 p. m.

At Scranton, connections are made with trains on the Lackawanna and Elmburg R.R. to and from Philadelphia, Kingston, Wilkes-Barre, Berwick, Bloomsburg, Danville, Northumberland, Harrisburg and intermediate stations, and with trains on the Delaware and Hudson Railroad from Carthage and intermediate stations.
