

Notwithstanding the act of Con-gress making those notes of the United States, sometimes called "Greenbacks," a legal tender in paymeut of debts, prices of all articles of merchandise, farm produce of every kind, and nearly all property, rose in price or nomin-al value to compare or equalize with the deprecia-tion in value of the paper money, or circulating pardium, the seller was obliged to receive in payment.
