Rules and Regulations. The Committee and Secretary have an honor on the Grounds where the Judges are requested to meet at 9 o'clock on the 8th day, when their names will be called and vacancies filled, and they will be furnished with the Books filled, and they will proceed to decide upon the merits of the articles and animals entered for premiums, and report in writing at one o'clock, the next day.

It is important that all persons appointed on Awarding Committees should be present at that hour. The Judges can resort for instructions and to make out reports to the office.

Any animals entered for exhibitions in one class, cannot compete in any other class, except as of a herd. The awarding committees must have the names of all articles entered on the Secretary's Book before the close of the second day of the Fair, and a card, which will be received from the Secretary, H. C. Tyler, must be secured by the exhibitor, to be exhibited. They must be on the ground for exhibition by 9 o'clock, a. m., of the third day, or they cannot receive a premium.

Supervisors of the different departments will have all animals and articles systematically arranged. The officers of the Society and Superintendents will be known by their official badges.

No premium will be awarded to any person exhibiting animals or articles not entered in the name of the bona fide owner of the same. Premiums not called for before January 1, will be considered donated to the Society.

A sufficient police force will be in attendance, day and night, to protect the property of exhibitors. Arrangements are made for keeping stock overnight in covered stalls.

Entries may be made any time previous to the Fair, by calling on the Secretary, H. C. Tyler, at his office over Wilson's store, as no entry of article or animal will be made on the 8th day of the Fair.

All the Judges and Superintendents that are here in time will receive a ticket for a free dinner. DAILY ORDER OF ADJUDICATION. The gates will be open from 7 o'clock, a. m., until 5 p. m. each day.

September 18th, second day, at 11 a. m., a mule race will take place on the Fair Grounds, no man to ride his own mule. The first premium of \$50 will be awarded to the mule coming in last, and a second premium of \$25 to the mule next to last.

At 2 p. m., a sack race will also take place on the Grounds, and a premium of \$25 awarded to the best man, and \$1 to the second best. At 3 p. m., a premium of \$25 will be given to the man or woman who will run around the Course in the quickest time—not less than three to start.
