## Road Sand,

The sand obtained from turnpikes, or close bayers. roads macadamized with any sort of gran-ite, hard blue stones, very difficult to break and pulverize, has a peculiar value. The grinding of such rocks or stones un-der the iron-rimmed whiels of wagons, the wear of horses shoes, and the mixture of this ground rock with the manuer of this ground rook with the manue-reattered along the roads produces a compound which is found to be highly accep-table to trees and plants. The gra ite rock we know is rich in potash and silica but it is not these elements alone which give this road sand its pecular value. By the process of grinding and triturating inert substances such as oyster shells. charcoal, quicksilver, we develope medi-cinal and other virtues which these substances do not possess in their crude state. And so it is supposed to be with road sand. By the constant grinding and trinrating of the iron-bound wheels and horse shoes, the comminuted granite becomes prepared for the use of plants; and when this road sand is mixed well with the compost heap and saturated with liquid manure, it is found to help the ef-Scaey of the compound in a remarkable manner. Under the influence of the road sand of this kind alone, it is said that when applied to lawns, white clover is sure to spring up in the greatest luxuriance and abundance where it was never seen before. - Gardener's Mouthly.

Crocuses should be planted in Octo ber or November. Set the halbs about three inches apart and cover with not more than two inches of earth. Before winter sets in, cover the bed with a lattle straw, course manure, or other litter, to prevent the bulbs being thrown out by the frost. The crocus will flower well in the house in winter—naif a dozen or more m a little pot—or in baskets of moss, or in any other way that good taste may suggest. The birds may be set so close as almost to to touch each other.

Ammonia is a useful household article which it is worth while to keep on land for common purposes. It is excellent for cleansing paint, silver, and glass; a tea-spoonful put in the water produces wonderful effect. Wherever there is grease to be removed, ammonin is efficacious. Consequently it is excellent for elerning hair-brushes. Indeed, it is an almost indispensable toilet article.

A CORRESPONDENT of the Ohio Farmer states that he kent a plum-tree free from carculios by sprinkling the ground ander the tree with corn-meal. This induced the chickens to scratch and search. The meal was strewn every morning from the time the trees blossomed until the fruit was large enough to be out of danger. The consequences was that the fowls picked up the curculus with the meal and the tree being saved from the presence of the insects was wonderfully fruitful.

Portray-houses should be warm, light. and well ventilated, and yet a majority of them are darks close, and uncomfortable. As a natural consequence, the fowls con-tinued in them are generally weak, drooping, und diseased.






