The following excellent suggestions are offered by a Vermont farmer: "The way that most farmers save their winter apples is to hele them up like potatoes or pile them up in a cave or cellar." By this method you not only lose much valuable time, but lose very many apples; and what you do keep over winter are in and what you do keep over winter are in bad condition. Apples may be kept in barrels that are quite open; but the best and cheapest way is to keep them in crates or boxes made in the following manner: The ends or head pieces should be ten or twelve inches wide by fifteen to eighteen long. They can be sawed or split. Nail your boards on the bottom and sides, leaving places for ventilation. Have your boards all the same lenth-about three

feet."
"When you gather your apples from those boxes (be the trees, put them in these boxes (be careful not to bruise them) and lay the boxes on each other in your apple house Two men will handle the boxes with ease You can look your apples over in these boxes at any time with but little labor.-When you are ready to ship, just mail a board over the top and you are ready. In this way you get your apples to market in good condition and handle them but Keep your house as cold as possible at all times without freezing."

Why do Eggs Spoil.

We find lining the shell a thick skin which when kept in a healthy condition by the albumen of the egg, is impervious to air, but if the egg remains too long in one po-sition the yolk, being heavier than the albumen, gradually sinks through it, and having none of the qualities requisite for keeping the skin labricated and healthy, the skin soon becomes dry and pervious to air, which penetrates through it to the yolk, causing the mass to rot. Therefore the true plan is to keep the yolk in its central position. By doing this the egg can be preserved for a long time.—
My plan for accomplishing this is to take a keg or barrel and pack the eggs on their sides, end to end, laying a tier first around next the staves, and so continuountil a layer is filled; so on until the barrel is full. Use cats for packing; jathem down as much as it is require keep them firmly in their places; head up the barrel ready for market. By roll ing the barrel about a quarter around every few days the volk of the egg will be kept as required. By making chalk marks across the head of the barrel at right angles across each other you wil have a guide for rolling the barrel as required. When eggs are packed in large quantities for market I think this plan will be found convenient and safe. - Cul-

Influence of Odor on Butter,

Butter kept in a room over night with the family (in winter,) is not fit to use,—
it has absorbed so much of the udors
that it has become foul. The taste of the bad air is plainly perceptible. But cover you butter plate (not an old one) with a tight dish—say a thin basin, and your butter will be found much the same as when placed there. It is, however, only perfect when kept—not occasionally put—in fresh air. Housekeepers take note when once tainted it can never be cured, but tenacionsly holds all it has, and gets all it can. Like Charcont, or gymp-sum; or earth, it is a powerful absorber. From the time it is gathered in the cow until it is eaten in the family, the greatest care must be given to the lacted product. Not only that, it reaches still far ther; the food, the water, must not possess the oder. But generally the worst is in the vessels and the atmosphere that comes in contact with it. These at least,

Indeed, we are far from thinking that rick meadow-hay, finely scented as it is, and apparently, so tull of nourishment, is fitted for any description of horse that is required to go tast, and we are quite cetain that thouounds of horses are destroyed annually by the effects of hay and water. The latter cannot be too soft, and when not so it should be given with a small portion of bran in it .- Prarie Farmer.
