

FARM AND HOUSEHOLD. Extensive Land Owners. The San Francisco Bulletin says: "There are probably more large land owners in California than any other State in the Union. Many large ranches have been cut up. But while this has been done, other parcels of lands have been concentrated in few hands. Edward Applegate owns 49,146 acres of land in Fresno county; C. Burrell owns 23,403 acres in the same county; W. S. Chapman owns 35,713 acres, and W. S. Chapman & Co. own 89,886 in the same county; James Seelig & Co. own 26,664 acres; Miller & Lux own 128,649 acres; J. O. Earl has 47,450 acres; J. H. Goodman is credited with 19,000; W. Pierce et al., have 25,763 acres; A. J. Pope, 20,270 acres; J. W. Pearson has 44,831 acres; Joseph Russ owns 23,169 acres in Humboldt; Mrs. M. E. Beales holds 173,065 acres in Kern county; J. H. Redding owns 46,720 in the same county; W. C. Balstone has 15,415 acres; Chapman, Johnson and others, 74,408 acres; B. Bryan, 20,520 acres; A. Well has 49,920 acres; Clark & Cox, 16,960 acres; and W. S. Bailey & Co., 19,755 acres in Alameda county. Charles McLaughlin has 24,876 acres in Contra Costa county, and over 60,000 acres in Amador county. The greater part of the lands represented above have been acquired independently of Mexican grants. The average cost for the whole was probably not much over a dollar in gold per acre. Greenbacks and scrip of various kinds have been used while some have bought for cash at second hands. These great land-owners have a good opportunity to bring in colonies and build up flourishing towns. Very little has yet been done in this way in this State."

Storing Roots for Winter. Thousands of bushels of potatoes and other roots are lost annually through insufficient protection from the cold. It is not necessary to store roots in a cellar. A well covered pit out of doors will keep them fresher and with equal safety. Only the small quantity of potatoes and other roots which a family needs during extreme weather should be kept in cellars under dwelling houses. There is some degree of fermentation and decay in large bodies of any kind of vegetable, even in cold weather, and the effluvia from these is a cause of fever and other diseases often prevalent in some houses every winter and spring. But to keep potatoes in its requires some judgment and a understanding of the business. Last winter grain exposed to the weather froze in some places four feet deep, and this extreme cold was a source of great loss. Of course no farmer would think of burying potatoes four feet deep, and even if he did they might be frozen, as the heap would necessarily be a mound on the surface of the ground completely exposed to the weather. The great secret of success is to have the earth piled in layers with some substance between which will lay loosely, and thus hold a quantity of dead air, one of the best non-conductors of heat. Anything which will keep a quantity of air undisturbed between the roots and the blast of winter will answer the purpose. The best way to do this is to have not less than two, and better still if three coverings of coarse, dry straw, lying as loosely as possible, and each well covered with a good coating of earth. If potatoes are dug early they may be covered at first only with straw and potato vines. As danger of frost approaches cover with six to seven inches of earth. Then give another liberal coating of coarse straw—the cruder the better—and cover this at least ten inches deep with earth. If more covering be needed, another layer of straw, lightly covered with earth, will afford ample protection in the severest weather. It is not the depth of soil so much as the imprisoned air confined with and under the straw which insures success.

The Foot of a Horse. The human hand has often been taken to illustrate Divine wisdom—and very well. But have you ever examined your horse's hoof? It is hardly less curious in its parts. Its parts are somewhat less complicated, yet their design is simple and obvious. The hoof is not, as it appears to the careless eye, a mere lump of insensate bone, fastened to the leg by a joint. It is made up of a series of thin layers, or leaves, of horn, about 500 in number, and nicely fitted to each other, and forming a filling to the foot itself. Then there are as many more layers, belonging to what is called the "cushion," and fitted into this. These are elastic. Take a quire of paper and insert the last one by one into those of another quire, and you will get some idea of the arrangement of the several layers. Now, the weight of the horse rests on as many elastic springs as there are layers in his hoof—about 4,000; and all this is confined, not only for the conveyance of his own body, but for whatever burdens may be laid on him.—Rural Home.

SAVAGE MEAT.—If you want it extra nice, take two nice fresh hams and one shoulder; take off the skin, and have it chopped nicely, season it with salt, pepper, sage, and a very little sugar. If you like spiced meat, use with that a few cloves, some mace, and nutmeg. Keep it in a dry cool place, and fry it in butter, or stuff the skin when you first make it for sausage.
