Beales holds 173,065 REARY WARE CLUTHING acres in Kern county; J. H. Reding on has 46,720 in the same county; W. C. Ralstone has 15.415 acres; Chapman Jenson and others. 74.408 acres; B. Bryan 20,520 acres; A. Well has 49,920 acres; Clark & Cox, 16,960 acres; and W. S. Bailey & Co., 19,735 acres in Alameda county. Charles McLaughlin has 24. 876 acres in Contra Costa county, and over 60,000 acres in Amador county. Storing Roots for Winter.

Thousands of bushels of potatoes and other roots are lost annually through insufficient protection from the cold. It is not necessary to store roots in a cellar .-A well covered pit out of doors will keep them fresher and with equal safety. Only the small quantity of potatoes and other roots which a family needs during extreme weather should be kept in cellars under dwelling houses. There is some degree of fermentation and decay in large bodies of any kind of vegetable, even in cold weather, and the effluvia from these is a cause of fevers and other diseases often prevalent in some houses every winter and spring. But to keep potatoes in 1 its requires some judgment and understanding of the business. Last winter ground All the above open mg in large variety at the store of exposed to the weather froze in some places four feet deep, and this extreme co.d was a source of great loss. Of course no farmer would think of burying potatoes four feet deep, and even if he dd they might be frozen, as the heap would necmight be frozen, as the heap would necessarily be a mound on the surface of the J.
