Hanging Baskets.

German Washing Fluid.

Dr. Queensville, in the Mo illen's Scientifique, describes a mode of washing which has been widely adopted in Germany and NEW CARPETS Belgium. The operation consists in dissolving, two pounds of soap in about three gallons of water as hot as the hand can bear, and adding to this one tablespoonful of turpentine and three of liquid ammonia; the mixture must then be stirred, and the linen steeped in it for two or three hours, taking care to cover up the vessel containing them as nearly hermetically as possible. The clothes are afterward washed out and rinsed in the usual way. The soap and water may be heated and used a second time, but in that case half s tablespoonful of turpentine and a taklesnoonful of ammonia must be added. The process is said to cause a great cconomy of time, labor and fuel. The linen scarcely suffers at all. as there is little necessity for rubbing, and its cleanliness and color are perfect. The ammonia and turpentine, although their detersive action is great, have no injurious effect upon the linen; and while the former NEW FALL GOODS! 


