**Stock Horses.**  
—  
The true test of a good stock horse, is his proven ability to transmit his good qualities to his get and any one about to engage in the raising of colts, must be careful, or he will be most woefully deceived. The country is full of young untried horses, with Right Royal Pedigrees, owned, and raised by good men, who undoubtedly believe their horse will prove himself to be a first class stock horse, and just here, how do they expect to prove it? why at the expense of those they can prevail upon to use their untried horse, and if he is an utter failure, where is your remedy? You have none. I hold and claim that the owner of a stock horse should prove his worth at his own expense, before trying to scatter his stock over the country. The above is my views, long held and in support of those views, I will quote from Merry's work:—"The fact is this, that in addition to temperament and protection of structure, over and above desirableness of nervous and muscular organization, there does exist in certain horses the power to propagate their most perfect points and characteristics, which other horses, equally perfect in themselves, perhaps do not have. What this power is, or where it is, or how the horse came by it, no one can tell. It cannot be imputed, nothing short of an actual demonstration can prove that it exists. It is this which makes a stallion worthy to be kept as a stock horse, and nothing else can, no matter how beautiful nor how sound, nor how speedy, nor how well connected in pedigree, a colt may be; he should never be advertised to the breeding public, until by actual service with his own brood mares, his owner is made aware of his capacity to reproduce his own excellence in his get. I maintain that any other course includes a fraud upon the public, in that he advertises as certain what he knows, or should know, is extremely uncertain, for this reproducing capacity is withheld by some strange freak or unascertained reason of nature from most horses, and bestowed only upon the few, out of a hundred stallions of a state, only two or three ever become justly famous. We lay it down as the first maxim of intelligent breeding, that a stock horse that is to be judged by his stock rather than by himself, and that the stallion that gets the best colts is the best one to patronize. — Here we have the views of one of the most successful breeders, clearly laid down. Now let us look for a moment, at the way our farmers are trying to improve our stock of horses. They take no pains, and make no effort to find a really good stock horse, to buy him, and keep him for the express purpose of improving their stock, but patronize the first horse they come across at the time, if he is only cheap enough and his owner will guarantee the colt shall stand up, and the consequence is that you may have a good colt or not, as luck will have it, or your dam may be a good one, in which case you have her alone to thank for your good colt. And now having grown a good colt, he is perhaps three coming four and you wish to mate him; you search in vain. The horse you used, may have got fifty colts in your section, and yet you cannot mate your colt. A conclusive proof in my mind, that the sire was a mongrel, and unfit to breed from. Show me a good stock horse and I will put out his colts among any number of other colts. A stock horse that does not stamp his get, with his own form, build, style of action, disposition, and nervous temperament also endurance, should at once be emasculated. And now a few words in regard to size of sire. Merry says: "As to the height and size, I say unhesitatingly, that the perfect horse in this respect is one that stands fifteen hands and two inches high, (sixty-two inches) and weighs ten hundred and fifty pounds." This is the standard of perfection; an inch either way or height or fifty pounds in weight, is allowable; but for speed and endurance, for the purpose of general driving and for the track, and, therefore for the purpose of breeding, no stallion should weigh less than one thousand, or more than sixteen hundred pounds. Neither should he stand higher than sixty-three inches, or lower than sixty. The best stock horse that ever lived on this continent, and the one that has proved himself "the most valuable, in his descendants, Old Justin Morgan was, according to Lindley, about fourteen hands high, (sixty inches), and weighed about nine hundred and fifty pounds. When he weighed less than nine hundred, he would pull a heavier log than any twelve hundred horse that could be found in the States of Maine and Vermont. He would not only pull a log that these heavier horses could not even start, but pull it with two heavy men sitting astride of it. It is also in proof that there was not a horse to be found that could beat him, running eighty rods; testing was not then a fashion. Now Messrs. Editors, if you would like to have some more on this subject, I will write an article or two.
