sigh of a great milker.

The Ayrshires have been bred chiefly for milk, and will probably yield a greater quantity for the food consumed than any other breed. There is no race that can equal the Ayrshire in quantity of milk; it generally being estimated at from 30 to 50 periods per day. A committee appointed for the purpose, testified under oath, that one of the Messrs, Wailcot & Campbell's cows gave 85 pounds o milk per day for several days in succes-

Hints for Horsekeepers,

A saddle put on loosely, with a slack girt is very irritating to a horse, and soon produces a sore back. A harness kept soft and pliable with good neatsfoot oil, will last almost a lifetime. It is stronger, because slightly elastic, and will seldom wear the hair off. A horse left uncovered when not in exercise, will soon grow a coat of coarse hair. This becomes a hindrance to rapid motion, and should be prevented by judicious blanketing. Your hers's shoes will hold no longer if the clinches are not weakened by the file in finishing. In-ist that the file does not touch the and of the nate where turned over. Some horses have a habit of stepping on one side of their feet, perhaps to provent pressure on a hidden corn. The part of the shoe exposed to severe wear should be protected with steel. All carriage shafts of right construction, should allow the brdy of the animal perfect freedom, and only touching at the well pudded saddle and full collar. An over-reaching horse-one whose hind feet are frequently hitting the forward shoes-should wear Leavy shoes forward and light ones behind. The theory is, that the heavier hoof will be thrown a little farther shead at each step than the lighter one.

Gumming in Fruit Trees.

A writer in a paper on the cause and cure of gumming in fruit trees gives the following practical suggestion on the subjet: Among the remedical measures which have been proposed for the cure of this gum disease, there is one which, to my own knowledge, has been very effect that. This is the scarification of the bark. I have seen frees which were severely attacked by the disease and unable to produce any but small shoots, com-pletely restored to health and sending forth fresh, vigorous sheets, after long-itudinal incisions had been made in the bark of the branches. The open wounds keep up a very active irritation in the bark, and the food stores are divided to the formation of new and healthy cellules, and ceases to be drained away to the gum centres, while the vital energies of the plant soon that to recover head of the plant soon tend to resume their regular course. Sorrel,

Sorrel may be eradicated the same as other weeds, by summer fallowing, or by putting the land in the production of which will make i necessary to keep the soil clean. If the soil contains many seeds, it may be necessary to follow this course for more than one year. Another method of subdue ing sorrelis to put the land into some forage crop and manures that will stimulate its growth. Red or white clover ar good crops, and lime and plaster good manures for this purpose. At one time it was believed that an application of lime was sure to kill out sorrel, and a the same time was certain to sustain the growth of valuable plants. The fact that sorrel may be found growing in the crevices of ledges of lime rocks will disprove this theory. It is quite certain that the only agency the lime exerts is to sustain the growth of the plants which will overshadow tue sorrel, and thus check its

Keeping Winter Apples.

A member of the Michigan Pomological Society stated, at a late Armian meet ing, that he was very successful in keep ing winter apples, and had secured sound fresh fruit in May, by the following treat ment : He picks the fruit in October and places it in heaps in the orchard and covers them with hay. These heaps re main until December, the slight moisture of the earth and the few inches of hay preventing any injury to the apples, even during sharp freezes. They are then assorted and packed in barrels, which, after beading up, are placed in a cold cellar, which is kept at a temperature of about thirty-two degrees, and if it should hap-
